Lyotard, (he say...)

Knowledge is a type of power and is communicated through narratives.

Lyotard felt that grand narratives pushed the smaller narratives aside. He was distrustful of any 'grand narrative' which claimed to have access to absolute truth .

In <u>La Condition Postmoderne: Rapport sur le savoir (The Postmodern Condition: A Report on</u> <u>Knowledge</u>) (1979), he calls postmodernism, <u>'an incredulity towards meta-narratives'</u>. Meta-narratives, or sometimes called 'grand narratives' - are comprehensive explanations of experience or knowledge about the world, such as the progress of history, the know-ability of everything by science, and the possibility of absolute truth.
